DEREGULATION 101

In 1997, Massachusetts passed the Electricity Restructuring Act, which allowed for the Municipal Aggregation of electricity for the Commonwealth's cities and towns.

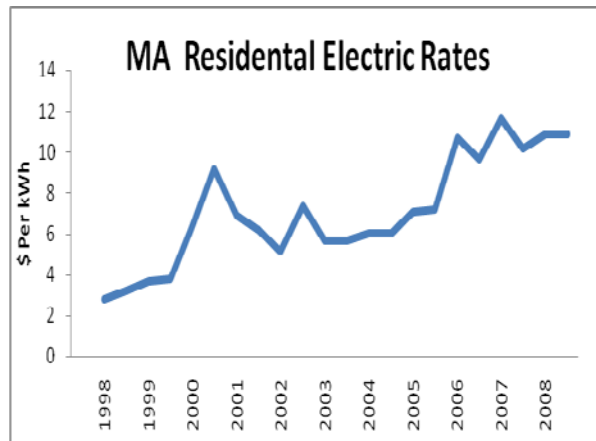
THE PROBLEM

This chart shows that the average price per kilowatt-hour for Massachusetts residents has risen from about 2 cents to almost 11 cents in less than ten years.

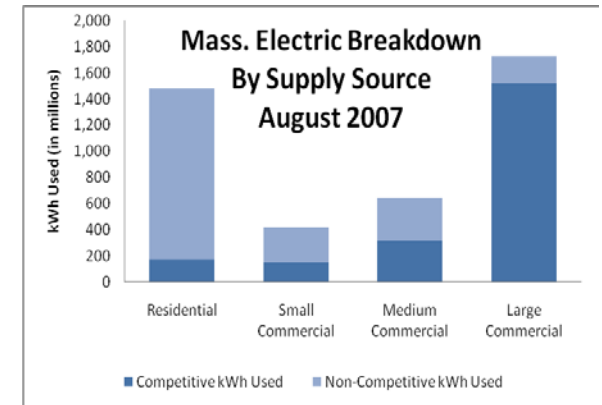
- RFP for Consulting Services
